



## **Frequently Asked Questions**

- 1. Where do I register for participation?
  - o Register/payment is online HERE
  - There will then be 2 dates for auditions consisting of singing, dancing, reading from the script, if necessary, and costume measurements. You only need to attend ONE audition that best fits your schedule –August 16th 6-8 pm or August 17th 3-6 pm. (Link for auditions will be sent in August.) If neither date/time works, we will provide the opportunity to audition via Video Submission.
- 2. How much does it cost to participate?
  - o Participation is \$425 per participant. For sibling discount, please call the box office at 630-447-8497.
- 3. How are the kids cast?
  - o Casting is based on talent, fit for role and availability for rehearsals.
- 4. Where are rehearsals and where are performances?
  - o Rehearsals will take place in our REHEARSAL space in Lisle, 1989 University Lane Unit D,(near Benet Academy) and will begin September 3, 2024.
  - o Performances take place at the Theatre at Meiley-Swallow Hall on the campus of North Central College, 31 S. Ellsworth St., Naperville, IL 60540
  - O Dates/times of performances: (ASL interpretation & touch tour and audio described performances will also take place). Tickets will be available to purchase for friends and family of the performers before the general public.
    - 1. Saturday, October 19 at 11 am & 2 pm
    - 2. Sunday, October 20 at 6 pm
    - 3. Saturday, October 26 at 11 am and 2 pm
    - 4. Sunday, October 27 at 6 pm
- 5. What does the rehearsal schedule look like?
  - The rehearsal schedule is built around the availability of the kids as best as possible. Typical rehearsals will run 12 2pm on Saturdays, 1-4pm on Sundays and 6-7:30 pm on Tuesdays & Wednesdays. Actors are *not* called every rehearsal but only on an as- needed basis.
  - o Conflicts are allowed and must be marked on the audition sheet to be excused. Actors CAN NOT miss tech week (October 13-17, 2024) or performances. There is only ONE CAST.
- 6. What makes this program different from others?
  - o **BrightSide Theatre Youth Project** is guided by the belief that involvement in arts programs increases the development in children on both an academic and social scale while building self-esteem. The **BrightSide Theatre Youth Project** is designed to provide a professional and educational learning experience for grade school to high school students aged 8-18 interested in exploring musical theater. In this program, children work directly with professional directors, musical directors, choreographers, designers, and artists to develop their own theatrical skills.
